Livestock Departments

Livestock Departments – Rules and Regulations

1. **Interpretations and Violations of Rules:** The North Central Arkansas District Fair board of directors reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of or connected with, or incident to the North Central Arkansas District Fair exhibition, and the right to amend or add to any of these rules as determined by the NCADF board of directors.
2. **Entry Fees and Deadlines:** All livestock entries including horses and poultry and rabbits must register by **September 1, 2010**.
 - **New Rule - All livestock entries including horses, poultry and rabbits must be made online** at <http://ncadf.fairmanager.com>. It is very important that all information requested is entered. The NCADF must have breed information for the breed classes. If an exhibitor does not have access to a computer, please contact your Vo-Ag instructor or your County Extension Agent.
 - Entry fees are \$7.50 for beef and dairy cattle and \$5.00 for horses, goats, sheep, and swine. There is no entry fee for poultry and rabbits.
 - A late entry fee of \$15.00 for beef and dairy cattle and \$10.00 for horses, goats, sheep, and swine will be charged for entries received after September 1st. No entries will be accepted after **Monday, September 20, 2010**.
 - All entries will be entered in the computer before the fair opens which will make it possible for the NCADF officials to have the premium checks out before the state fair opens.
3. **North Central Arkansas District Fair exhibitors are restricted as follows:**
 - Beef and Dairy exhibition is open to junior and open exhibitors. Goats, Sheep, and Swine exhibition is only open to junior exhibitors because of space limitations. Poultry and Rabbits exhibition is open to junior and open exhibitors. Junior exhibitors are defined as those 19 years of age or younger, single and never have been married. Exhibitors may not exhibit after graduating from high school or earning a GED except for the fall following graduation.
 - Exhibitors must reside in one of the counties in the NCADF area---Cleburne, Fulton, IZARD, Sharp, Stone or Van Buren counties or attend school in one of these counties or be a member of a 4-H club or FFA chapter in the 6-county district area. The NCADF board of directors has approved Independence county exhibitors who are 4-H or FFA members to show in the NCA district fair since Independence County will not be officially included in the NCADF area until 2011. No state funds will be used to pay premiums for Independence County exhibitors..

- Junior exhibitors must be a member of a 4-H club or FFA chapter and be under the supervision of 4-H or FFA advisor. Exhibitors who are not old enough to be in 4-H or FFA can show under the supervision of their parents/guardian.
 - Exhibitors may show in only one district fair in Arkansas. The North Central Arkansas District Fair Board reserves the right to withhold premium money if exhibitors do not abide by this rule.
4. **Showing:** All exhibitors must show their own animals unless exhibitor has more than one animal in a class. If the exhibitor has more than one animal in a class, another junior member may show their animal (s).
 5. **Breeding Beef Ownership:** Exhibitors must own their own animals and must have acquired title and taken possession of the animal by July 15, 2010. All breeding animals must be registered in the exhibitor's name (not the farm name). No pending registration will be accepted.
 6. **Control of Animals:** All open and junior exhibitors must have complete control of their animals in the show ring at all times. If, in the opinion of the Show official, an animal is unruly to the point of endangering other exhibitors or animals, that animal will be excused from the ring and disqualified. All breeding cattle and steers for exhibition must be shown with halters and be sufficiently gentle to be properly handled by one attendant on foot. All Bulls, 6 months old or older on date of show, must be shown with a nose ring or nose clip and lead attached.
 7. **Livestock Check-In:** All breeding animals in the beef, swine and sheep departments must have the animal's original registration papers (or faxed copies from breed associations) in possession when animals enter the fairgrounds. **All entry fees that are due must be paid at check-in or premiums will be withheld.** Animals must be checked in during official check-in times or their entries will be deleted from the records.
 8. **Premiums:** NCADF will pay premiums based on the total amount of money allocated from the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission and local funds after other awards are purchased. Premiums are paid on a point basis.
 9. **Youth Showmanship Contests:** A showmanship contest will be included in each department and ribbons will be awarded but no premiums will be paid. Contests will be held for Wee Junior (age 8 and under), Junior (ages 9-13), and Senior (ages 14-19). Age is based on age on January 1, 2010.
 10. **Care of Animals:** Exhibitors will be responsible for the care and feeding of their animals. They should bring their own feed troughs and water buckets. Water will be furnished. Livestock trailers can be parked on the fairgrounds in the assigned location. All stalls, pens, and aisles must be cleaned by exhibitors before checking out. Please check with the department superintendent before loading animals and leaving the fairgrounds. Failure to comply with official check-out times will result in forfeiture of premium money.
 11. **Bedding:** Each exhibitor will provide their own bedding. No straw is allowed in the barn,

- 12. Purebred Animals:** All animals in Registered Breeding Beef classes, including Composites, must have registration papers. Purebred animals must be 75% or greater, depending on the respective breed associations; composite animals must be registered as low percentage with the respective breed association. These composite breeds will have their own breed divisions: (1) Charolais Composite, (2) Lim-Flex, (3) Maintainer, (4) Shorthorn Plus, and (5) Sim Solution. AOB (All Other Breeds) Composite maybe divided due to breeding at the discretion of the livestock superintendent. (Poultry, rabbits, and commercial and market classes are exempt).
- 13. Health Regulations:** Refer to the Arkansas Livestock and Poultry Commission Health Regulations for exhibition requirements. The NCADF reserves the right to have a blood and urine laboratory analysis made for animals at the fair. Any exhibitor administering a drug to an animal which would render the carcass unfit for human consumption or any exhibitor of an animal's producing an analysis indicating the presence of an unapproved drug that can result in a quantitative or qualitative change in the characteristics of the animal will be required to return all premium money and could be banned from further competition at the fair. Their name and lab analysis will be submitted to the USDA for further investigation and possible prosecution. Any animal receiving medication for any life threatening disease or illness must be registered at the time they are entered in the fair.
- 14. Exhibitor Affidavit:** All livestock exhibitors should turn in the Exhibitor Affidavit stating that their animals are healthy at check-in.
- 15. Sick or Diseased Animals:** Sick or diseased animals will not be permitted to show. In the event that a disease is detected, the owner will be asked to remove the animal from the fairgrounds. In the case of a dispute, fair officials will have authority to call a veterinarian at the expense of the owner.
- 16. FDA approved implants:** may be used in steers, however, no drugs of any sort will be administered without strictly following recommended withdrawal procedures. All entries are subject to visual inspection and/or laboratory testing.
- 17. The Act of Artificially Filling Animals Internally:** This would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method is prohibited. Silicone injections or those injections for cosmetic purposes are prohibited. The only exception to this rule is only in the case of a severely dehydrated animal, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered with the approval of the show superintendent.
- 18. Camper Hookups:** FFA chapters or individuals may rent space for a travel trailer during the NCADF. The rental fee is \$15.00 per night. The fee is to be paid at the livestock office and a tag will be issued to be placed on the travel trailer.

- 20.** Questions regarding livestock exhibits should be emailed to the livestock superintendents.

Beef Cattle – Dept. 15

(Open to all recognized breeds)

New Rule – All Cattle must be entered online at <http://ncadf.fairmanager.com> by September 1, 2010. If an exhibitor does not have access to a computer, contact your County Extension Office or Vo-Ag Instructor. No late entries will be accepted after September 20, 2010 and a late fee will be charged.

Junior Crossbred Replacement Heifer Show

1. Crossbred replacement heifers are defined as any crossbred female or percentage female not eligible for a purebred show.
2. Animals must be born prior to March 15, 2009 and all animals must have baby teeth at time of show.
3. Classes will be divided by hip height and/or weight
4. Commercial heifers will be divided into three (3) divisions: (1) American (2) English (3) Exotic.
5. Classes in each division will be determined after entries are in place to allow for uniform classes in each division.

Junior Market Steer Show

1. No bulls, stags, or horned steers may be exhibited.
2. Only steers of breeding beef parentage are eligible to show.
3. Classes will be divided by hip height and/or weight.
4. Classes in each division will be determined after entries are in place to allow for uniform classes in each division.

Junior Breeding Beef Show

1. An exhibitor can enter no more than two (2) animals per class.
2. Animals under six (6) months of age or over two (2) years of age cannot be entered in breeding beef classes.
3. All bulls nine (9) months of age or older must be shown with a nose ring (permanent or temporary).

Open Breeding Beef Show

1. The Open Breeding Beef Show is open to adult and junior exhibitors who reside in the counties in the North Central District.
2. This show is limited to Breeding Beef only (registered animals).
3. There will be no commercial heifer, steer, or showmanship classes in the Open Breeding Beef Show.
4. Points are calculated as follows: 1st place – 40 pts; 2nd place – 35 pts; 3rd place – 30 pts; 4th place – 25 pts; 5th place – 20 pts; 6th place – 19 pts; 7th place – 18 pts; 8th place - 17 pts; 9th place – 16 pts; and 10th place – 15 pts.

1. **New Rule** – All Horses must be entered online at <http://ncadf.fairmanager.com> by **September 1, 2010**. If an exhibitor does not have access to a computer, contact your County Extension Office, Vo-Ag Instructor, or the Horse Superintendent. No late entries will be accepted after **September 20, 2010** and a late fee will be charged.
2. All breeds may be exhibited.
3. Coggins test and papers will be checked at the entrance of the fairgrounds. Papers must match horse. Any exhibitor without current Coggins papers, will not be permitted on fairgrounds.
4. Horses must be owned by exhibitor/exhibitor family **by July 15, 2010**.
5. Points are awarded as follows: 1st place – 25 pts, 2nd place – 20 pts, 3rd place – 15 pts, 4th place – 10 pts, and 5th place – 5 pts.

Swine -- Dept. 18

All Swine must be owned by Junior Exhibitor by July 15, 2010.
 Maximum weight for Market, Commercial Gilts, and Barrows is 280 lbs. for 2010.
 Minimum weight for Market, Commercial gilts and Barrows is 200 lbs for 2010.

New Rule – All hogs must be entered online at <http://ncadf.fairmanager.com> by September 1, 2010. If an exhibitor does not have access to a computer, contact your County Extension Agent or Vo-Ag Instructor. No late entries will be accepted after **September 20, 2010** and a late fee will be charged.

Market Hogs

1. Market hogs can only be exhibited by junior exhibitors.
2. Each Vo-Ag teacher or county Agent will be issued a weight sheet to record the declared weight of the animal. They must be filled out in ink. Animals may also be weighed on official scales and weight recorded by the superintendent or a person designated by the superintendent.

Barrows

1. The Grand Champion Market Hog will not compete in the Barrow Show.

Commercial Gilts

1. Commercial gilt is defined as any gilt that is crossbred or any purebred gilt that is ineligible for registration.
2. The Grand Champion Market Hog will not compete in the Commercial Gilt Show.
3. The Grand Champion Gilt will not show for Supreme Breeding Swine.

Breeding Swine

1. All animals must have a registration certificate at time of entry. No pending registration will be accepted. Pigs farrowing after April 30, 2010 cannot compete.

Chapter Entries: all animals must be registered in the name of the FFA Chapter. Registration papers must be in the hands of the youth exhibitor or inspected by the department clerk before showing for proof of ownership and age of animal.

Breeding swine will be shown in the following order: (1) Duroc, (2) Hampshire, (3) Yorkshire, and (4) All Other Breeds.

Points Value

All classes will be placed as follows: 1st place – 24 pts, 2nd place – 20 pts, 3rd place – 18 pts, 4th place – 17 pts, 5th place – 16 pts, 6th place – 15 pts, 7th place – 14 pts, 8th place – 13 pts, 9th place – 11 pts and 10th place – 10 pts.

Goats – Dept. 19

New Rule – All Goats must be entered online at <http://ncadf.fairmanager.com> by **September 1, 2010**. If an exhibitor does not have access to a computer, contact your County Extension Agent or Vo-Ag Instructor. No late entries will be accepted after **September 20, 2010** and a late fee will be charged.

1. Young bucks **ONLY**. Age 12 months and younger. Young bucks will show in the buck show only.
2. The Junior Market Goat show is restricted to **junior exhibitors**.
3. Exhibitors will be limited to two entries in each class and may have a maximum of three in the market goat classes.
4. Goats must be owned by the exhibitors by **July 15, 2010**.
5. All registered goats must have a legible tattoo, as recorded on registration certificate. All goats must wear a Scrapie identification ear tag.
6. Animals must be owned and registered in the exhibitor's name. No pending registrations will be accepted.
7. Does and wethers will show but does shown in the dairy goat show may not show in the market goat show.
8. The minimum weight is 50 pounds with no maximum weight.
9. Market goats must have baby teeth.
- 10. Any breed of goat or cross may show in the market show but a separate entry is required on the entry form or must be made online.**
11. Goats may have horns but horns must be tipped for safety.
12. Each Vo-Ag Instructor or County Extension agent will be issued a weight sheet to record the declared weight of the animal. This must be filled out in ink. Animals must be weighed on official scales and weight recorded by the superintendent or someone designated by the superintendent.
13. All entries may be tested for drugs.
14. Each class will be placed 1st through 10th place and points will be awarded as follows: 1st place - 24 pts, 2nd place – 20 pts, 3rd place – 18 pts, 4th place – 17 pts, 5th place – 16 pts, 6th place – 15 pts, 7th place – 14 pts, 8th place – 13 pts, 9th place – 11 pts, and 10th place – 10 pts.

Sheep - Dept. 20

New Rule – All Sheep must be entered online at <http://ncadf.fairmanager.com> by **September 1, 2010**. If an exhibitor does not have access to a computer, contact your County Extension Agent or Vo-Ag Instructor. No late entries will be accepted after **September 20, 2010** and a late fee will be charged.

Rules for Sheep Show

1. Only market lambs owned and shown by junior exhibitors will be shown.
2. Market lambs must be owned by exhibitor **by July 15, 2010**.
3. All animals must have ear tag in at least one ear and a Scrapies tag.
4. Each exhibitor may show up to three (3) market lambs.
5. Minimum weight is 80 pounds with no maximum weight.
6. There may be a weigh back of the top five (5) animals in the each class.
7. The animal must be within 5% of the declared weight.
8. Official scales will be available for checking weights. Only authorized personnel will weigh animals.
9. All entries may be tested for drugs.
10. In order to secure the most educational value from the market lamb show, the judging will be conducted as follows: (1) Classes will be split by weight by the superintendent without regard to breed; (2) The number of classes will be at the discretion of the superintendent. Equal number of animals will be put into classes whenever possible. The first place winner in each class will compete for the Grand Champion with second place on hand for Reserve Champion.
11. The Grand Champion Market Lamb will not be allowed to compete in Commercial Ewe classes.
12. All Breeding Sheep must have registration certificate in the exhibitors name at time of entry. No pending registrations will be allowed.

Arkansas Bred Lamb Show

1. Lambs will be shown by weight. Classes will be divided according to the number of lambs entered.
2. For a lamb to show in the Arkansas Bred Lamb Show, the lambs must have an ABL ear tag number in the ear.
All other rules pertaining to the Market Lamb Show will be followed.

Commercial Ewe Show

1. Commercial ewe is defined as any ewe that is crossbred or any purebred ewe that is ineligible for registration.
2. Minimum weight is 80 pounds with no maximum weight.

Point Value: Each class will be placed 1st through 10th place and points will be awarded as follows: 1st place - 24 pts, 2nd place – 20 pts, 3rd place – 18 pts, 4th place – 17 pts, 5th place – 16 pts, 6th place – 15 pts, 7th place – 14 pts, 8th place – 13 pts, 9th place – 11 pts, and 10th place – 10 pts.
